Club records and new personal bests are set



RECORD BREAKER: Lauren York has broken a Scunthorpe Anchor club record with her performance in the 400m freestyle.

SCUNTHORPE Anchor held their annual Club Championships at Riddings Pool, with several of the club's swimmers looking to record county qualifying performances.

An excellent 20 county times were achieved, with some huge personal bests from most swimmers in the 400m freestyle and the 400m individual medley.

Becki Foster slashed over 24 seconds off her 400m IM time and Holly Williams knocked 28 seconds off her 400m IM.

Scott Strong had two great swims, managing a PB by 20 seconds for his 400m free and an incredible 34 seconds for his 400m IM.

Other notable swims came from Caitlin and Bryony Bower, Kieran Skinner, Josh Jones, Jack Newton, and Francis Moir, who knocked over a minute off her previous best time.

Two club records were broken by Lauren York and Jasmin Kirk in their 400m freestyle events.

More county times were achieved

Swimming

in the 200m individual medley and out of 28 swims, 24 were PBs.

Bryony Bower put in a magnificent swim with an improvement of 19 seconds and Anya Snow also knocked 15 seconds off her entry time.

The 10-years-and-under 50 metres fly was the first ever gala swim for some of Anchor's younger swimmers.

Eight-year-old Jonathan Manchester had a good race, closely followed by Jack Christer.

In the next heat, 10-year-old Scott Zimmerman broke the club record with a time of 38.24.

Scott is currently the Yorkshire ASA nine-year-old 50 metres fly record holder and will aim to repeat this at the Yorkshire Counties as a 10-year-old.

The 11-years-and-over 100m freestyle had more times tumbling as huge PBs went to Axel Schygiol and Scott Strong in the boys event and Ellie Taylor and Melanie Calder

in the girls event.

Sam Neal had a great swim to complete his first ever 200m breast-stroke race, while Adam Vaughan knocked 30 seconds off his previous time and Michael Trueman dropped 20 seconds off of his.

The girls followed with Lauren Gwynne and Lauren Jacklin having a fantastic race against each other, both coming home within less than a second of each other.

Twelve-year-old Caitlin Bower had a great race against Jasmin Kirk (16) and Lauren York (14) in the final heat, who together pushed her to a new time of 2:53.22, a 13-second PB.

In the 200m freestyle, Sven Schygiol had a massive 48-second PB,

followed by Michael Trueman with a 29-second PB and nine-year-old Ben Cantrill, on his second swim at this event set a 21-second PB.

The girls again followed, with Anya Snow knocking over 15 seconds off her previous time, as did Bryony Bower and Melanie Calder.

While Francis Moir set a massive PB with an improvement of over 50 seconds.
