**Records tumble for Anchor stars**

FORTY-nine personal bests tumbled on a medal-laden weekend for Scunthorpe Anchor. A squad of 13 swimmers travelled across the bridge to the Ennerdale Leisure Centre, Hull, to take part in a short course open event. With 89 races in total, there was plenty of opportunities to show off their talents – which they duly did.

But the weekend overall went to 10-year-old Jack Newton, who won nine medals from 13 races, finishing second overall in the 10/11 years of age category, landing personal bests in all but one event.

Adam Vaughan and Lauren Callaghan chalked up personal record times in all events they entered, while Yasmin Callaghan and Amy Baker increased the medal haul.

Molly Newton swam superbly in the 200m breaststroke, earning herself an improvement of five seconds on her PB to add to her other four PBs she had already swam.

Sisters Jenna and Chloe King both swam 100m freestyle races, each registering PBs to add to the club's tally.

Becci Foster showed how all her hard work in training has paid off, knocking more than five seconds off her 200m backstroke and seven seconds off her 100m fly – overall, Becci had six PB's from nine races.

New club records also went to Jack, and Holly Williams, in the gruelling 200m fly, with times of 3.02.85s and 3.01.35s respectively.

Ryan Johnson's time of 1.46.37s secured a PB for himself in the 100m breaststroke, while Becki Baker finished off with a PB in the 200m freestyle, in a time of 2.43.67s.
