Personal bests tumble

SCUNTHORPE Anchor swimmers made up the entire Cleethorpes and Scunthorpe Aquatics' (CASA) team for the first round of the Lincs Senior League in Lincoln.

And they certainly put on quite a show, finishing third behind Lincoln Vulcans and Louth.

Tom Spencer got CASA off to an exciting start, ending up third in a neck-and-neck 100 metres freestyle race.

Jasmine Kirk then achieved CASA's first victory, pipping Lincoln Vulcans A to the line.

The 10-years-and-under girls also proved they were a force to be reckoned with as Amy Baker, Lauren Gwynne, Lauren Jacklin and Yasmin Callaghan came first in

the medley and freestyle relays.

The 10-years-and-under boys team of Ben Cantrill, William East, Travis Johnson and Alex Minaudo also swam strongly in the freestyle relay, finishing second.

Jacklin took part in the 50m breaststroke, gaining a new personal best (PB), followed by Gwynne swimming the 50m freestyle and achieving a PB too.

Cantrill was chosen for the 50m backstroke and justified his selection, coming second.

The relay teams had all worked well and the girls' open team – Lauren York, Emma Sanderson, Jasmine Kirk and Rhiannon Haber – achieved first in the freestyle relay and second in the medley.

Jack Cowling swam his number one stroke, backstroke, and came in a close second.

In the 50m backstroke, Bryony Bower swam a new PB.

York took the 100m breaststroke by the scruff of the neck, easing to victory.

A three second improvement on his PB saw Johnson take first spot in the 50m fly, while Baker finished third in the girls section, before going on to swim the 50m backstroke, which she won with a time of 43.48 seconds.

Kieran Skinner had a busy day, swimming three individual races, and ending up second in all of them – 100m fly, 100m breaststroke and 100m backstroke – achieving a new PB in the breaststroke along the way.

The 14-year-old had to enlist help from the 12-years-and-under boys –

Cowling, Jack Newton and Finley Fox – for the relay events and, despite being a lot younger than the rest of the pool, they still achieved fourth in both races.

The 12-years-and-under boys also swam well in their individuals, with Scott Zimmerman clocking a time of 43.67 seconds in the 50m breaststroke. Fox swam to a second place finish.

Newton finished second in the 50m freestyle.

York took to the water for a second individual swim, in the 100m fly, and brought home maximum points and a new club record for herself as well.

Caitlin Bower then finished ahead of the rest in the 100m breaststroke, while Holly Williams swam a textbook 50m fly to finish in second, with a new PB of 37.05 seconds.
