TRAVIS Johnson was in no mood to be beaten as he swept the board at the Minster Meet.

Held in Beverley and hosted by Doncaster Darts, the event attracted competitors from 33 different clubs, including Scunthorpe Anchor, but it was Travis who led the way.

With the chance to compete for both awards and 'speeding tickets', the nine-year-old secured five out of five speeding tickets and five personal bests as well.

Finley Fox and Scott Strong finished as top boys in their respective age groups, with Finley achieving this accolade following two first places, one third place and two speeding tickets.

Scott was also a boy in form, with one top spot, two seconds and two fourths.

Adam Vaughan gained a first in the breaststroke, and a third in the backstroke, to more than compensate for the disappointment of missing out on third in the 50m butterfly.

Jonathan Manchester's hard work in training paid off with a first in the individual medley and third in the backstroke.

Ryan Johnson also found himself near the front in his races, coming first and third, while also picking up a speeding ticket, in new personal best times.

Rhiannon Haber came home first, second and third in the backstroke, freestyle and individual medley.

India Cowell and Jack Christer, both newcomers to open events, each earned two speeding tickets, while Lauren Callaghan had a clean sweep of personal bests which gave her four out of five speeding tickets.

Her sister Yasmin chalked up two further speeding tickets and a second place finish.

Amy Baker also managed to pick up two speeding tickets of her own.

Francis Moir finished ahead of the pack in the 50m breaststroke, which, coupled with a fourth place for Shannon Johnson in the same event, meant Scunthorpe Anchor ended as top club overall.
